Kentucky eTranscript Streamlines College Admission Process

August 6, 2013 – Blaine, Minn. – The Commonwealth of Kentucky Department of Education (KDE) has developed a statewide electronic transcript initiative, “Kentucky eTranscript.” The adoption of eTranscripts will ease the college admissions process, reduce costs and save valuable time for stakeholders.

The KDE recognized the advantages of establishing a data management system that was uniform from state level to the smallest district. In 2006, it chose Infinite Campus, the largest American-owned student information system, to serve its 174 districts.
